Podiatric Surgery is well established in Northamptonshire, and Ian Reilly leads the service for the local NHS Trust. Prior to this, he was a Senior Lecturer at the Northampton School of Podiatry and is about to finish his professional doctorate in 'corticosteroid injection therapy of the 1st MTP joint' at Staffordshire University. ### Foot Ulcers in Diabetes - prevention & care

### Spina Bifida Occulta - A case study

This presentation will use a case study approach of a male patient who suffered with Spina Bifida and the detrimental effects this had on his feet. The presenter was involved with this patient's care for over 25 years as he had presented with a minor lesion. This then progressed to an ulcer covering the complete sole of his one foot, with numerous sequestra being presented to the attending podiatrist over the years. The presentation will include an outline of Spina Bifida and its varying types, causes and discussions of complications for podiatrists and foot health practitioners. The presentation will also look at the outcomes of this condition and the social and holistic effects for the patient and their family as well as the podiatric care delivered over a long time period.

### Moisturising Creams – the reasons behind and functions of their ingredient content

The epidermal stratum corneum needs to maintain an optimal level of hydration to perform its protective barrier function effectively. Where the level of hydration is sub-optimal then the barrier function may be compromised and skin pathologies can arise. Daily use of a moisturising cream helps to increase hydration within the stratum corneum and so maintains effective epidermal skin function. In this presentation we will explore the purpose of all the ingredients in a moisturising cream, how they contribute to maintaining skin hydration (amongst other functions), and how understanding this can help you choose what type of moisturising cream for your patient to use.

### Lower Limb Neurology

Patients often present to clinic with vague signs and symptoms that may be linked to abnormality of the nervous system. It is important that we can effectively carry out a clinical examination and history to determine whether there is a need to refer the patient for further examinations and tests. To undertake the assessment and determine whether there is anything abnormal requires some understanding of the anatomy alongside how to examine the motor and sensory systems. This presentation provides an opportunity to revisit the basics and watch a clinical demonstration. As with all clinical practice the more we examine and familiarise ourselves with the approach the easier it gets. Taking a systematic approach will help as will undertaking it on normal as well as symptomatic patients.

### When bug relationships go bad: The skin microbiome & inflammatory disorders

This presentation will review the functional anatomy of the skin and identify the clinical and dermoscopic differences between atopic dermatitis (eczema) and psoriasis. It will also explore some of the latest research on the skin microbiome and its association with inflammatory conditions, within the context of implications for foot health management in clinical practice.

### Health Literacy: Do we need to get a handle on this before we provide education to our patients?

Health literacy is a recognised, but under-appreciated phenomenon. It is rarely factored into the typical clinicians' assessment/appraisal of a patient before patient-specific advice/education is provided. However, the literature is increasingly clear – health literacy levels in an individual is hugely predictive for how effective that patient education is likely to be at fostering some behaviour change in patients. It also exists as a very useful proxy for other important health markers/considerations. This presentation will explore what health literacy is, what influences it, how it can be assessed, and what strategies can be implemented to improve it.
